

Message from the Board

The Soo Finnish Nordic Ski Club has a long history of community service with respect to cross-country skiing in Sault Ste. Marie. As the club's name suggests, its roots stem directly from the many Finnish immigrants who settled in the Sault Ste. Marie area in the mid-1900s. These members of the Finnish immigrant community wanted to recreate a sense of community in their new home – and they succeeded! The *Canadian Finnish Club*, as it was initially named, was founded in 1953 and the *Soo Finnish Ski Club* was incorporated in March 1991.

We are Sault Ste. Marie, Ontario's premier cross country ski club with programs, lessons, events, and races that cater to all ages and abilities; located in the beautiful Hiawatha Highlands. Our club's volunteers and staff are active in building and maintaining the 35-kilometer trail system at Hiawatha Highlands. We are outdoor enthusiasts who promote the sport of cross country skiing, a sport for life, at the local, provincial, and national levels, competitively and recreationally. We are volunteers who appreciate the importance of giving back to our community. We are family and friends.

We lost a dear friend, a member of our club and executive, and a devoted volunteer this past July. There has not been a day that he is not thought of by our ski club family. A plaque will be installed shortly in Mr. Doug Cuddy's memory.

A special note of appreciation for many, many years of service goes to two members of our Board: Adriana Tomie and Betty van Kerkhof. Both members will be stepping down this year. Thank you, Betty and Adriana, for all of your support and 'skiing' us in the right direction.

This past 2016/2017 ski season was exceptional. Snow made its debut in time for our program start dates and it fell so well that we had over 380 cm! Thank you to the Hiawatha Highlands staff and trail volunteers for the daily maintenance of our second home.

We had excellent attendance at all of our events this year: the Trail Trot, Ski Swap, New Year's Eve Lantern Ski, Hiawatha Snowfest, Bon Soo Lantern Ski, Mabel Lake Ski Tour, Ski the Trails, and the Family & Friends Ski Day. There

were no cancellations due to extreme cold or mild temperatures! Appreciation goes out to the numerous volunteers who were involved with all of our events.

More good news: the Government of Canada is investing \$22,374 to help us, in partnership with the Kinsmen Club of Sault Ste. Marie and the Sault Ste. Marie Region Conservation Authority, replace existing lighting and install additional new lighting on the two-kilometre Kinsmen ski trail. Additional lighting will include access points from the parking lot to the ball field, and at the trail head of the Pinder Trail System. The funding will also help cover the costs of installation of a new outdoor speaker system. Thank you, Terry Sheehan, Member of Parliament for Sault Ste. Marie and the Government of Canada through the Canada 150 Community Infrastructure Program.

As a club member, we invite you to attend our monthly meetings and provide input or lend a hand with the preparations for the 2017/2018 season. Our Annual General Meeting is scheduled at the Civic Centre, on Wednesday, May 3, 2017 at 7 PM.

Members also participate in local events such as the Hiawatha Snowfest and the Maple Syrup Stampede. 



















